



## ENFORCEMENT REWARDS COMMITTEE 2015 YEAR END REPORT

The BC Wildlife Federation pays rewards of up to \$2000 for information leading to charges being laid against persons doing wanton damage to fish and wildlife or fish and wildlife habitat. This same reward is also offered for information resulting in charges being laid against persons doing wanton damage to the property of timber companies, farmers, ranchers and mining companies and other companies or individuals allowing hunters and anglers access to property they control. Most recommendations for rewards come from enforcement personnel but will be accepted from anyone. Once the circumstances are confirmed, the request for a reward goes before a committee consisting of a senior Conservation Officer, a senior Federal Fisheries Officer and the chair of the BCWF rewards Committee.

Inspector Barb Leslie of the Conservation Officer Service who has been a member of the Committee for the past four years is retiring. She is thanked for her efforts on this committee. Her replacement is Inspector Joe Caravetta.

During the year 2015 this committee paid out \$2000 in rewards. The files involved the killing of a moose out of season, the killing of deer out of season, allowing edible meat to spoil, and using a motor vehicle in an area where the use of a motor vehicle is prohibited.
